Course Descriptions

W0166 Emergency Medical Services: Functions in the Incident Command System

Students will practice use of the ICS in coordination with other public safety responders. As a follow-up to ICS 100 and ICS 200 training, this course will present scenarios requiring responders to structure their EMS resources within the guidance of NIMS-ICS as appropriate to the needs of the different incident types.

W0322 Incident command System for Structural Collapse Incidence (ICSSCI)

This course is designed to provide fire officers with an understanding of command operations at structural collapse incidents.

W0379 Initial Fire Investigation for Fire Responders

This course is designed specifically to provide a clear definition of the role of first responders in arson detection, provide essential knowledge to enable them to recognize the potential of intentionally set fires, preservation and protection of evidence, and proper reporting of information to appropriate officials. By strengthening the partnership between first responders and investigators, the chances for successfully solving arson-related crimes will increase. The course includes topics such as fire behavior, critical observations of the first responder, fire causes, scene security and evidence preservation, legal considerations and documentation of findings.

W0455 Strategy and Tactics for Initial Company Operations (STICO)

Students completing this course will be able to explain the purpose and use of the Communications Model and the Quick Access Prefire Plan (QAP) in tactical operations at fire incidents; define the relationship between incident priorities, strategy, tactics, and implementation in the Command Sequence.

W0522 Executive Skills Series: Exercising Leadership Through Difficult Conversations

This course is designed to provide knowledge and skills for having difficult conversations to exercise leadership in addressing adaptive challenges. The goal of this course is for the participant to identify and apply skills for having difficult conversations as they relate to exercising leadership when addressing adaptive challenges.

W0610 Introduction to Wildland/Urban Interface Firefighting for the Structural Company Officer

This course will identify operational activities and safety concerns for structural company officers assigned to a wildland/urban interface firefighting, interface environment, wildland fire behavior, command and control issues of wildland/urban interface firefighting and tactics.

W0730 Health and Safety Officer (revised)

This course examines the Health and Safety Officer's role in identifying, evaluating, and implementing policy and procedures that affect health and safety aspects for emergency responders. Risk analysis, wellness and other occupational safety issues will be the main emphasis of this course.

W0761 New Fire Chief II: Administrative Issues

This course is designed to provide students with the managerial, administrative and leadership skills and awareness necessary for new or recently appointed or elected chiefs to effectively meet their obligations of the position.

Travel Arrangements

You must make your own travel arrangements for the trip. Driving time is typically 8 hours from Rhode Island. Air travel can be arranged to either Washington National Airport or Baltimore-Washington International Airport. You will be responsible for providing your own transportation to NFA if you wish to fly.

Transportation costs are the responsibility of the student or his/her organization and will not be reimbursed by the National Fire Academy or the Rhode Island Instructors Association. Be sure to arrive at the NFA by 3 p.m. on Friday to check into the dormitory and attend the orientation session.

NFA No-Show Policy

It is the policy of the National Fire Academy that persons who fail to show up for class and have not canceled their enrollment will be suspended from attending NFA courses for a period of two years.
